

# SCW Basic Painting Suggestions

## 3: Moroccan Regulars

*According to Vallejo's Model Color 70 range chart*

*For all those seeking a painting schema where ultimate colours shown are closer to the base coating applied at start – perhaps more intuitive than those shown at Minairons figures box reverses. Useful too for those willing to be offered multiple choices.*

**Tip 1:** If your base coat uses to be darker than ultimate layers, then 70-876 or even 70-875 are OK for uniforms; otherwise, it would be advisable to choose 70-912 or 70-913 instead.

**Tip 2:** Regarding Late War tunic colour, same as for metropolitan infantry: If your base coat uses to be darker than ultimate layers, then 70-823 or the even deeper 70-924 Russian Uniform WWII are OK for tunic and trousers; otherwise, it would be advisable to choose 70-922 instead (green brightness can be reduced by mixing it with a drop of 70-879 Green Brown).
